

# Fully Restored in His Presence

*A one-page devotional about hope in Heaven/the New Earth*

*Revelation 21:4 (NLT) “He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain. All these things are gone forever.”*

*Isaiah 53:5 (NLT) “But he was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed.”*

*There are wounds we can see, and there are wounds we quietly carry. Some pain leaves marks on the body. Some pain settles deep in the heart. Grief, shame, fear, disappointment, anxiety, loss, betrayal, sickness, and sorrow can all remind us that this world is not yet as God intended it to be. But Scripture gives believers a hope that reaches beyond the brokenness of today. Revelation 21:4 is not a vague wish or sentimental comfort. It is a promise from the God who makes all things new.*

*The hope of Heaven and the New Earth is not simply that believers will escape suffering. It is that we will be fully restored in the presence of God. Every burden will be lifted. Every wound will be healed. Every fear will be silenced. Every trace of shame will be removed. Every tear will be tenderly wiped away by the One who saw every moment we suffered. And this restoration is possible because of Jesus.*

*Isaiah 53:5 points us to the suffering Savior. His healing is deeper than temporary relief. Through the cross, Jesus made the way for forgiveness, redemption, reconciliation, and eternal restoration. This means our pain, scars, fear or grief do not have the final word. Jesus does.*

*One day, believers will stand before Him fully whole. No more physical suffering. No more emotional wounds. No more memories that ache. No more shame from the past. No more fear of the future. No more goodbyes. No more graves. No more tears. In His presence, every believer will be fully restored.*

*Until that day, we still walk through a world touched by sorrow. But we do not walk without hope. The same Jesus who secured our eternal healing is with us in our present pain. He comforts us now, strengthens us now, and reminds us that what is broken will not stay broken forever.*

## REFLECT

What wound, fear, or grief do you need to entrust to Jesus today as you remember the promise of full restoration?

## PRAY

Jesus, thank You for the hope of Heaven and the New Earth. Thank You that by Your wounds, I am healed, and that one day all pain, grief, shame, fear, and suffering will be gone forever. Help me hold onto Your promise when life feels heavy. Comfort me in my sorrow, strengthen me in my weakness, and remind me that You are making all things new. Amen.
